Use it to explore nature in the City of Swan, play, create, imagine, look closer and have some fun with your friends and family.


- Try new nature activities.

Aboriginal History

Kaya - Hello! Wandju - Welcome!

The City of Swan has a particularly strong Aboriginal culture – and this is an ongoing connection which we are proud to have within our City.



The local Aboriginal people and custodians of the land are Whadjuk Noongar people. The Noongar people have long since inhabited the historic lands of the Swan coastal plain, dating back some 40,000 years.

The land provided a natural abundance of food and water resources and the traditional owners developed a rich history of customs in the area.
