

Five Things to Do

at Karijini National Park

Explore Ngirribungunha (Dales Gorge)

Whether you visit Ngirribungunha (Dales Gorge) for an hour or for a day, there's plenty of things to see and do!

There are two beautiful lookouts here. Head to Walhibindamunha (Circular Pool) Lookout to take in the plummeting red cliffs and the forest-like scenery at the bottom of the gorge, featuring a beautiful round pool of clear water.

Jubula (Fortescue Falls) Lookout offers views of the tree-lined gorge and the cascading waterfall to the west, and is completely accessible. Head down the stairs to make your way to Jubula (Fortescue Falls) and Jubura (Fern Pool) and enjoy a swim in the tranquil waters amongst nature.

Visit the Karijini Visitor Centre

The Karijini Visitor Centre is the perfect place to plan your adventure at Karijini National Park.

Speak to staff who can help you plan your day and offer advice on staying safe. Wander through the interactive displays and learn about the Aboriginal culture, plants, animals and geology of the area.

You can also pick up a Junior Ranger booklet, which has fun activities and questionnaires to complete at some of Karijini's iconic locations. Return to the Visitor Centre with the booklet completed to earn your Junior Ranger title!

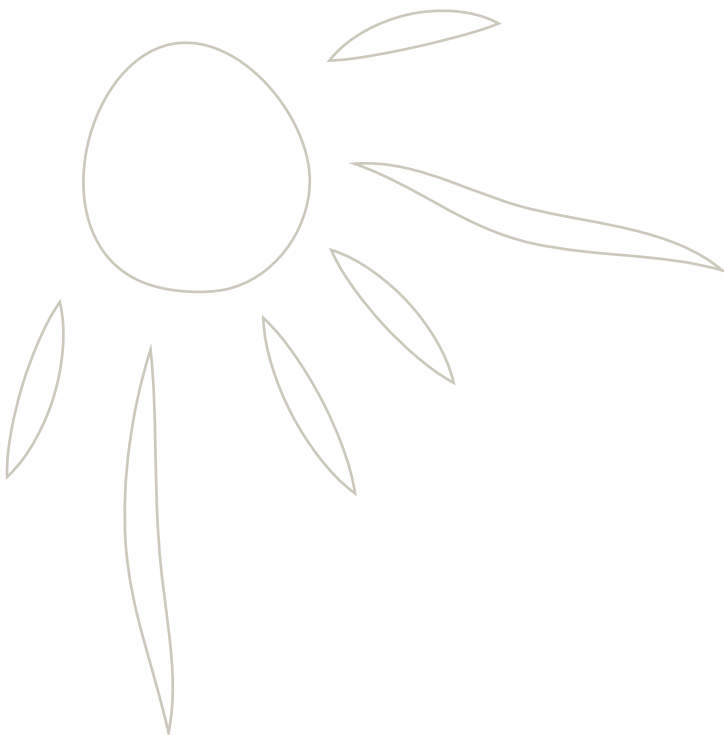

Enjoy a scenic drive

The Karijini landscape is unlike any other. Take it all in by going for a scenic drive through the park.

Watch as the varying sunlight changes the appearance of the landscape. Keep an eye out for wildlife, especially large birds of prey who are often flying above! Have a competition to see who can spot the biggest termite mound.

If you head down Karijini Drive, you should have a great view of the colossal Punurrunha (Mount Bruce). If you need to stretch your legs, turn into the Punurrunha car park and walk the 500 metre, Class 2 trail to Marandoo View.





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Picnic at Weano Recreation Area

Weano Recreation Area has all the facilities you need to relax and refuel.

Fry up some lunch on one of the barbecues or enjoy a snack at one of the shaded picnic tables, surrounded by the sights and sounds of local flora and fauna. There are also accessible toilet facilities available.

Wander down to Junction Pool Lookout to admire the views of Weano Gorge and the water below. This lookout is accessible for wheelchair users who have assistance.

Explore Minhthukundi

Minhthukundi (Hamersley Gorge) is another great place to spend the day, with accessible toilets (and an accessible lookout) available nearby.

There are multiple swimming areas to be explored, including two larger pools connected by a waterfall, and a spectacular river that flows between the gorge walls.

See if you can find the famous Spa Pool, a swimming area hidden between curved rock walls. The water upstream that eventually falls into the pool is exposed to sunlight, making it considerably warmer than other swimming spots in Karijini - hence the name, Spa Pool!
