Follow a Walk Trail

There are numerous trails within Walpole-Nornalup National Park that give visitors a closer look at vibrant wildflowers, huge native trees and wonderful wildlife.

Take a short walk to the top of Mount Clare for a view of the Southern Ocean and the Walpole Wilderness or wander along the coast on the Coalmine Beach Heritage Trail. Visit the <u>Explore Parks WA</u> <u>website</u> for more trails and information.

Whale Watching at Conspicuous Cliff

From June to September, humpback and Southern right whales can be spotted along the coast of Walpole on their journey north to their nursery grounds.

The lookouts atop Conspicuous Cliff are the perfect places to catch a glimpse of the migrating whales, and offer spectacular views of the beach, cliffs and ocean below.

Explore the Channels Picnic Area

Fish and picnic beside the scenic Walpole-Nornalup channel with spectacular views of The Knolls, whilst surrounded by towering karri, marri and tingle trees.

Follow the Knolls Walk Trail to see some of the area's incredible biodiversity. Use our Interpretive Trail on the Every Kid in a Park app to learn about the unique native plants and complete some fun challenges.

Walk amongst the Tree Tops at the Valley of the Giants

One of Walpole's main attractions, the Valley of the Giants Tree Top Walk is not to be missed!

The steel walkway seemingly floats 40 metres (at its highest point) above the ground in the canopy of the tingle forest, allowing visitors a bird's eye view of the treetops and surrounding valley. It is wheelchair and pram accessible.

Visit the Giant Tingle Tree and Circular Pool

The Giant Tingle Tree is a natural wonder. It's 75 metres tall and has a circumference of 24 metres! Over time, the base of the tree has been hollowed out by fire, allowing visitors to stand inside it.

Once you've marvelled at this beautiful tree, head up the road to Circular Pool. This tranquil spot features a pristine body of water surrounded by lush forest. Picnic, explore, or simply sit and enjoy your surroundings.
