## Every Kid in a Park Social Story

This is a Social Story<sup>™</sup> about visiting Serpentine Falls in Serpentine National Park.

Social stories help explain social situations to children and adults with autism spectrum disorder, intellectual disability, developmental delays and learning challenges.

A Social Story<sup>™</sup> answers the 'wh' questions – where and when a situation occurs, who is involved, what is happening and why. We suggest the Social Story<sup>™</sup> be meaningfully shared in a reassuring tone.

This Social Story<sup>™</sup> aims to help people of all abilities to plan and prepare for their visit to Serpentine Falls by explaining what they can expect on the day of their visit.

This Social Story<sup>™</sup> was developed by Nature Play WA in consultation with local educators.














I am going to visit Serpentine Falls in Serpentine National Park.

My trusted person will come with me.















There are picnic tables, walk trails and trees.

There are lots of things to do at Serpentine Falls. I might:

- follow the walk path to the falls
- go swimming
- see birds like magpies, ravens, Australian ringnecks, grey fantails and honeyeaters
- see kangaroos





My trusted person will show me where they are.














Snakes live around Serpentine Falls.

I will then need to slowly move away from the snake.


My trusted person will be able to help me.

I might hear the water flowing over the rocks.

I might hear noisy birds and animals.

There might be lots of people making noise.




Serpentine Falls is lots of fun!


